FAQ

Q. How long is each episode?

A. Each episode is around 45 minutes.

Q. Is this mostly a lecture format?

A. No. Parts are lecture, parts documentary-style description, and parts are an "office hours" style conversation between student and teacher.

Q. Is there a guide for a discussion to have after showing an episode?

A. Yes, you can access that here.

Q. There are five episodes, but I want to do a one-night event. What do you suggest?

A. We suggest you choose one episode to screen. The final episode of the series speaks directly to the word's reaction to the October 7 attack. This makes it a good choice to show as a teaser to the whole series. We would also suggest that you recruit a smaller group to watch the whole series, one episode at a time over several meetings

Q. What sort of equipment do I need to show the film?

A. You can stream the series directly from your computer using an HDMI connector that connects to a screen or projector. If you have a large audience, we suggest an eight-foot screen with the associated projector.

Q. Can my group meet with Dr. Wilf or the filmmaker, Ms. Zeigherman?

• Episode Blurbs

'Episode 1: Jewish History, Politics

- Emancipation and Political Zionism

We start with a brief history of the Jewish people leading up to the moment of Jewish emancipation in Europe. The offer of emancipation sparked a great debate among Jews. Some communities felt excitement about the prospect of individual equality and sought to assimilate further. Others felt that the Jews would never truly be viewed as equal in the nation-states that were forming around them. Zionism took root among the latter group, emerging as one of the many liberation movements of this time. The founders of political Zionism asserted that Jews should finally have a home and become masters of their own fate.

'Episode 2: Labor

- Communism/Socialism/Bundism and Labor Zionism

We continue with a comparison of two important Jewish movements in the first half of the 20th century: Labor Zionism and Bundism. Inspired by the rise of socialism and the ideal of self-determination, Labor Zionists worked to revitalize Jewish nationalism by immigrating to Palestine and working the land. At the same time, other Jews argued for remaining in Europe and working to create a utopia that would make distinct national identities obsolete. Although only Zionism has stood the test of time, these other contemporary movements help us understand the Jewish debate which was unfolding, dealing with the question of how to be Jew in the modern era.

Episode 3: Religion

- Jewish and Christian Anti-Zionism and Religious Zionism

For millennia, Jewish faith and tradition have always allowed for, and even encouraged, debate and disagreement. Zionism is no different in this respect. In this episode, we meet Rav Abraham Isaac Kook, a wellspring of Jewish and Zionist thought with a deep influence on the religious Zionist movement today. Additionally, we focus on the sources underlying Jewish religious anti-Zionism and its impacts on contemporary debate. We also look at varying views of Zionist from Christian leaders, some supportive and some fiercely oppositional.

Episode 4: The Middle East

- Islamic and Arab Anti-Zionism and the Birth of the State of Israel

The creation of the modern State of Israel was met with Arab and Islamic anti-Zionism. We learn about the historical place of Jews in Arab society, the mass expulsion of Jews from the Arab world in the 20th century, and the role of anti-Zionism as a unifying force in the Arab world ever since. We also discuss the struggles and successes of the establishment of the modern state of Israel.

Episode 5: Secularism

- Soviet, Anti-Imperialism and Left Wing Anti-Zionism

In this episode, we learn about the history of Soviet anti-Zionism, and its influence on today's western left-wing anti-Zionism. We consider a recent innovative intellectual analysis of anti-Zionism which ties together themes from the course, and apply the theory to recent protests following the October 7th attacks. Finally, we discuss the ultimate goals of Zionism and anti-Zionism in today's world and the role they play in politics, Western life, and the hope of Arab Zionism. **PROMOTIONAL IMAGES**
